SEASON OF LENT

Stones come in all shapes, sizes, and colors. Some are given great monetary value and some are very useful to sculpt statues or build structures that can stand a thousand years. However, most just lie there, often getting in the way. Yet God calls us to become "living stones!" What does this mean? How can this transformation happen? Who are these living stones in our midst and which ones, yet unearthed, will also spring to life?

1. GATHERING

Musical Prelude

Call to Worship (Based on Joel 2:1-2, 12-17) Leader: Get up and blow your horn; sound the alarm from Horsetooth rock! Let everyone know that the day of the LORD's salvation is near! People: For some it will be a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! L: But the LORD holds out hope for us saying, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning. Tear open your hearts, not merely your clothes, and return to the LORD, your God, who

is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and who is abundant in steadfast love rather than punishment. **P**: Our God desires to bless us and not to punish us. So, blow the trumpet loud and return to true, holy worship.

L: Gather everyone together; the aged and the children, for the bridegroom awaits for us the bride. ALL: Let us arise and follow the true God who can save us!

Opening Prayer (based on Psalm 51:1-17)

All: Let us offer one another signs of peace, reconciliation, and love.


2. HEARING GOD'S WORD
